## Septic Deferral program

- May 2023 LWMP Addendum Steering Committee
  - Support for septic deferral program to defer sewer operating costs for up to 5 years
- Proposed eligibility:
  - Septic system age <5 years at date of required sewer connection (~2028 for Phase 1A)
  - Type 2 or 3 systems
- Proposed eligible deferral costs:
  - Sewer operating costs (\$530 \$650/year)
  - Private property costs connection & septic decommissioning (\$2,500 \$11,500)
- Deferral time 5 years (or until property is sold)



#### Septic Maintenance Program

- October 16, 2023 EASC report
  - Support for region-wide program
    - Mandatory inspections in 'high-risk' areas
    - Mandatory pump-outs in all other areas
  - Requires BC cabinet approval of order in council
    - OIC request Summer 2024
  - Inclusion in SES LWMP Addendum
    - Allows program to proceed in plan area if region-wide program doesn't move forward
