Your Community's Updates

Seal Bay Park: Trail and Parking

Seal Bay Park is getting a new parking area off Hardy Road to address ongoing safety concerns. This new facility was identified as a short-term priority action item in the Seal Bay Park Management Plan. The parking area includes room for 62 vehicles as well as horse trailer parking, and a day use area with outhouse and picnic tables. Sewer System Planning and Upgrades

I continue to support residents in Electoral Area B as they engage with the Comox Valley Sewage Commission regarding Comox Valley Sewer System planning and key infrastructure in our community. There are two areas of activity lately:

- 1. The liquid waste management plan (LWMP) under development to determine future planning for the regional sewer service.
- 2. Concerns from residents near the treatment plant about operations and odour.




Your Area: Your CVRD Services

Electoral Area B (Lazo North) includes the Comox Peninsula, Little River, Balmoral Beach Area, Point Holmes, Bates Beach, Huband Road and the Tsolum regions. Electoral Area B no longer includes Kye Bay.
