Have your say with Unified Alternative Approval Process

This year, the CVRD has introduced a new, streamlined opportunity to get direction from residents about initiatives that require their approval. Rather than a series of Alternative Approval Processes (AAPs) – known to some as counter-petitions – spread throughout the year, one unified AAP will be held in 2021 and it's underway now. The goal is to make it easier for the public to keep track of the proposals, and when/how to participate.

Here's what you need to know:

- The AAP is open from June 3-July 5, 2021.
- If you support the services being proposed, you don't need to do anything.
- If you're opposed you need to submit an elector response form. These can be downloaded at www.comoxvalleyrd.ca/aap
- If 10 per cent of eligible electors submit forms in opposition, the board may choose to not proceed with the proposal at all, or may choose to hold a referendum to obtain voter support.

This year, there are a few key initiatives underway that will be of interest to Area A residents:



Roadside Garbage and Recycling Collection: A service for garbage and recycling pickup is being proposed for rural neighbourhoods, in particular, Union Bay and Fanny Bay which currently don't have a regional service (though some subscribe to private pick up). Community Facilities Support: The CVRD is seeking elector approval to start a service that will support community halls on an ongoing basis. Currently, halls such as Royston, Fallen Alders, Union Bay, Fanny Bay and Ships Point are required to submit an annual grant application for operational funding. This service would provide consistent and reliable funding to these public facilities.

Community Grants

Community grants are an important way to support programs and facilities throughout the CVRD. In April, Electoral Area Directors approved over \$165,000 in grant funds to non-profit organizations throughout the region.

Among the regional initiatives that received grant funding from all electoral areas are:

- LUSH Valley Food Action Society: \$15,000
 To facilitate the 2021/2022 activities of the Comox Valley Food Policy Council.
- Comox Valley Land Trust: \$10,000
 To build local climate resiliency by protecting, restoring and connecting sensitive ecosystems in the watershed.
- Youth and Ecological Restoration Program: \$5,300 To assist training at-risk youth in ecological inventory techniques within the CVRD area.

In total, 25 grants were awarded from the Electoral Area A funds, including:

- Denman Island Education Society: \$1,500
- Hornby Island Community Radio: \$2,500
- Royston Community Club: \$2,500

Union Bay conversion work underway



On July 1, 2021, the Union Bay Improvement District's services (water, streetlighting and fire protection) will

officially convert to the CVRD. The move is the result of the November 2020 referendum, where residents in Union Bay voted 72 percent in favour of converting these services to the regional district and dissolving the UBID.

The transition work includes a formal legal process, as well as significant practical planning for the switchover of operations. The CVRD and UBID are working together to ensure the smooth transition. While Union Bay residents won't notice much change in services, they will now receive bills from the CVRD for those services, and payment will go to the CVRD. The UBID offices will close June 30, 2021.

NOTICE: Changes to Bylaw Service

Changes are being made to bylaw enforcement services in order to streamline delivery in the CVRD. Here's what you need to know:

- Currently, bylaw enforcement is delivered through five different services (each requiring different administration requirements).
- Staff has proposed reorganizing into two services one for Areas A, B and C, and one for Denman and Hornby Island.
- The change was proposed as part of the COVID Response and Renewal program review undertaken in fall 2020, where each CVRD department reviewed services to look for efficiencies and to re-focus on community priorities.

This update will not change any of the regulations, and will have no cost impact for taxpayers.
