### **Executive Summary**

The CVRD Board's 2023-2026 Strategic Plan was endorsed last year and established the focus and priority for the term of office and confirmed the Regional District's:

- vision statement;
- strategic drivers;
- core services with key service outcomes; and
- strategic initiatives.

The Board also considered its response to the ongoing housing crisis with immediate and subsequent direction to undertake three strategic housing initiatives: Housing Action Plan, Homelessness Needs Assessment and Community Plan and Direct-action Feasibility Study.

Based on the active and current nature of the Strategic Plan and the regular reporting on the strategic initiatives, the May 30<sup>th</sup> planning session has been structured to focus on the strategic housing initiatives while still providing the Board with an opportunity to consider other elements of the Strategic Plan, if desired.

# ITEM **TOPIC & DESCRIPTION** Homelessness Needs Assessment and Community Plan 5) Lisa Moffat, Resilience Planning, to present an overview and status update on the development of a Homelessness Needs Assessment and Community Plan that will mobilize regional resources around strategies to prevent and decrease the occurrence and duration of homelessness and support residents in achieving housing stability. **Direct-action Feasibility Study** 6) Sue Ritchie Raymond, Tim Welch Consulting, and Cassandra Vink, Vink Consulting, to present an overview and status update on the Directaction Feasibility Study. The intention of this initiative is to examine the feasibility of direct-action approaches for the CVRD to realize the creation of new non-market affordable housing. This study will examine the different approaches for the creation of affordable housing, including the creation of a housing entity. The consultants will be facilitating a discussion about potential roles and activities (e.g. development, management, capacity and/or other support to existing non-profits) to support and catalyze housing development. Following discussion on the potential roles the Board will then consider the structure for such activities, including: - Creation of a local government corporation. - Creation of a non-profit society. - Creation of an external arms-length entity that could include a housing development corporation and/or community land trust. - Empowerment and support to a local non-profit organization. Establishment of an in-house function or office. Board feedback on the potential role and structure will be sought to help inform the remaining phases of this Direct-action Feasibility Study.
