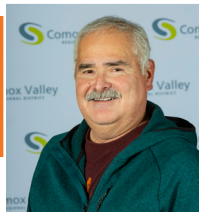

### Have Your Say on the CVRD 2026 Budget

Each year the CVRD updates budgets for nearly 100 services – each with its own budget and five-year financial plan. Starting in early February, CVRD committees will begin hearing budget presentations from staff.

## CVRD Moves Forward with Housing Authority

Housing affordability is one of the most significant challenges facing the Comox Valley, affecting urban and rural residents.

While the impacts are being felt widely, the crisis more directly affects low- and moderate-income households, who cannot afford rents based on the current market prices.

To support this growing need, the CVRD is moving ahead with the new Comox Valley Housing Authority to support the creation of more non-market housing. This type of housing is generally built by non-profit housing organizations with rents based on costs, not profit. In December 2025, the CVRD Board formally approved its creation and work is underway to launch the initiative. This is an important step toward improving long-term affordable housing for residents across the region.

### Union Bay Firehall Construction Begins

Construction of the new Union Bay Fire Hall has been awarded to Knappett Industries. Work is expected to begin this winter with completion planned for winter 2026. The hall will provide a modern, reliable space to support effective emergency response in and around Union Bay. It replaces an aging building which cannot fit modern fire trucks, lacks proper storage, parking, training areas, and basic firefighter facilities such as showers and laundry.

### New Shingle Spit Boat Launch

The Shingle Spit Boat Launch has been upgraded with one design modification yet to be completed on the ramp. Designed with guidance from the community, the project included demolition of the old ramp and installation of new pilings, precast concrete deck tiles, and a floating dock. The improved ramp will provide reliable access for recreational boaters and strengthens emergency response and evacuation capabilities, ensuring this community amenity is ready for decades of use. Future ramp modifications will involve community guidance.

### CVRD Supports Fanny Bay Hall

In November 2025, the Fanny Bay Community Association (FBCA) received a report identifying risks to the Fanny Bay Hall roof under heavy snow loads. With closure possible, the CVRD and FBCA worked in record time to secure funding and upgrades began in late November with minimal program disruption. The CVRD values our many partnerships with rural community organizations and thanks the FBCA's proactive efforts.

### Climate Work at Pélxwikw/Goose Spit

The Pélxwikw/Goose Spit Climate Resiliency Project is advancing under the leadership of the CVRD and K'ómoks First Nation. A fall kickoff meeting brought together local, provincial, and federal partners, and a smaller roundtable will now be guiding engineering, ecological, and archaeological studies. Recent storms and high water levels highlight rising flood risks and the need for climate-resilience work in the region. The project is funded through the provincial Disaster Resilience and Innovation Fund.

### Lazo Greenway Officially Open

The Lazo Greenway Multi-Use Path is now open. The 2.5-km trail between Butchers Road and Sand Pines Drive in Area B offers a safe, accessible link for walkers and cyclists, with asphalt and gravel surfaces, crossings, benches, a drinking fountain, and amphibian-friendly design. Final paving near Butchers and Beckton occurred in December alongside sewer works. The project was delivered by the CVRD in partnership with the Town of Comox, Government of Canada, and BC Ministry of Transportation and Transit.

### Dyke Road Park To Include Resilient, Restored Shoreline

Dyke Road Park is planning to reopen in summer 2026 with a new boardwalk, viewing platform, and fish channel. In partnership with the K'ómoks First Nation, the Stewardship Centre for BC and many other community groups, the project used a nature-based approach to revitalize the site while improving ecological values and the visitor experience.

### Fire Hall Construction Begins This Spring

Construction of the converted Mount Washington Fire Hall begins this spring, creating a dedicated emergency response station with new truck bays, equipment storage, and training space for urgently needed volunteer firefighters.

Since acquiring the former Mountain Centre in 2025, the site has supported training, recreation, and community events, with existing users—including the Strathcona Nordic Ski Club—continuing to have access.

### Planning Spike Road Park's Next Chapter

The future of Spike Road Park is taking shape. Feedback from 2025 surveys and open houses will guide a draft management plan. The 190-acre Area C park protects sensitive wetlands and supports the One Spot Trail. Since acquisition, staff have completed environmental, cultural, and agricultural assessments and removed unsafe structures. The park will open once planning and associated development are complete.

### More Recycling Options Planned for Oyster River

Comox Strathcona Waste Management (CSWM) acquired the Oyster River Recycling Depot in August 2025, to ensure it stays a community asset. Planned improvements include building upgrades and expanded parking. CSWM is working with Recycle BC to explore adding glass, foam, and flexible plastic recycling. The depot now accepts paper, hard plastics, and metal cans. Stay tuned for more details in 2026.

## Roadwork Wraps Up; Conveyance Project Moves Ahead

With major roadwork on Comox Avenue and Comox Road now complete, we want to thank residents living along the Dyke Road and the public for your patience during construction. This milestone signals the end of most of the road closures for this important project, which helps protect the Comox Estuary, Point Holmes, Goose Spit, and Baynes Sound by replacing aging sewer pipes and pump stations.

The remaining work includes pump station upgrades in Comox, at K'ómoks First Nation, and a new Courtenay station beside Kus Kus Sum, to be finished in the spring. The project remains on schedule and on budget.

## Are We Ready for a Winter Emergency?

Comox Valley Emergency Management helps the community respond when disaster strikes, working year-round with local municipalities and the K'ómoks First Nation to prepare for emergencies. In a major winter event with snow, ice, flooding, or power outages, however, help may take 72 hours or more to arrive. You can be ready by:

- Creating an emergency plan
- Learning when to safely shut off water, power, and gas
- Signing up for local emergency alerts ("Get Notified" system)
- Preparing emergency kits and grab-and-go bags for household members and pets
- Staying connected to trusted sources such as EmergencyInfoBC, and DriveBC for road updates and weather alerts

Neighbourhood Emergency Preparedness sessions cover FireSmart™, support services, radio communications, and how to prepare for floods, extreme weather, and winter storms.
