

Know Your Water System

Do you know which water system your property is connected to? The Comox Valley Regional District (CVRD) manages six different water systems, each one unique in its own way based on water supply, location, infrastructure, and water source risk level.

- Black-Creek Oyster Bay Water System serving 2,200 residents.
- Comox Valley Water System and Comox Water Local Service Area serving 50,000 residents.
- Denman Island Water System serving 50 residents and is connected to the Graham Lake Water System.

- Graham Lake Water System serving 150 residents on Denman Island.
- Royston Water System serving 2,000 residents and is connected to the Village of Cumberland's water distribution system.
- Union Bay Water System provides water to approximately 1,500 residents.


