3C's for Backyard Burning Alternatives

- Compost Composting is an easy and inexpensive way to turn yard and gardening refuse into a usable and valuable product.
- 2. Chip Chipping brush, land clearing debris and wood

- waste makes an excellent mulch substitute, protects soil and keep weeds at bay. When using chips follow FireSmart TM practices.
- **3.** Cycle Grass cycle by leaving grass clippings on your lawn to add nutrients back into the soil for a healthy attractive lawn.
