The Transportation core service comprises the Comox Valley Transit service (780), in partnership with BC Transit, and electoral area transportation initiatives (503). Other transportation initiatives are executed through partnerships. Key objectives include improved mobility options for residents, reducing GHG emissions, and providing convenient, affordable, safe alternatives to automobiles within the community.


