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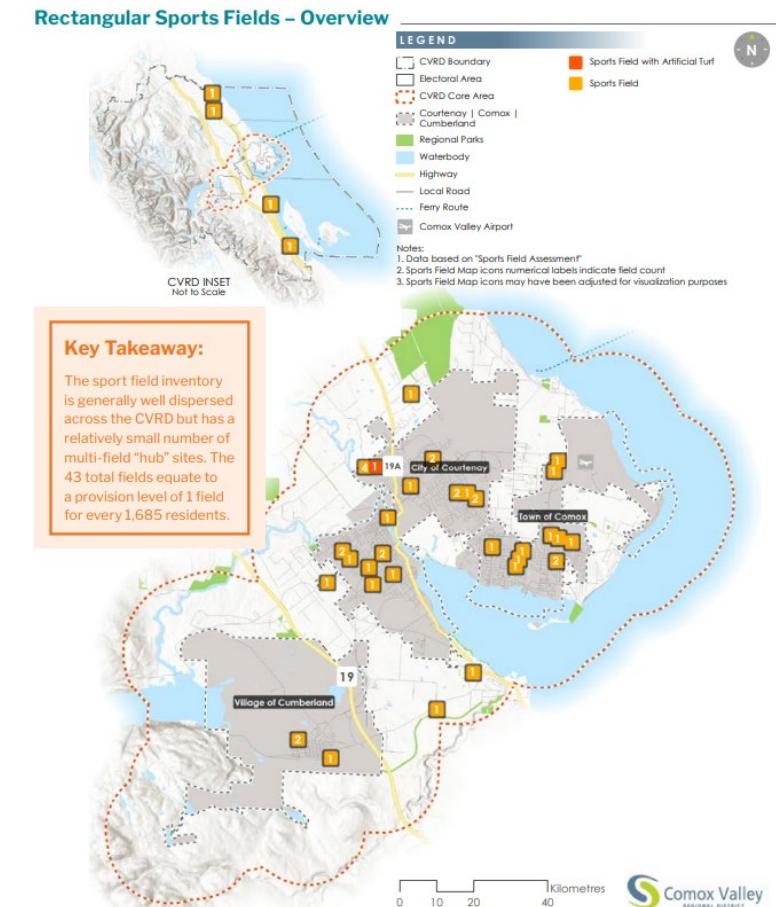

Purpose	To provide funding for the maintenance and capital costs of the all-weather sports track and sports playing fields in the City of Courtenay, the Town of Comox and Electoral Areas A, B and C

Maximum Levy	\$.04 per \$1,000 - 100% Assessment Proposed increase in the maximum requisition to accommodate borrowing to construct a new artificial turf field

# 2025 Accomplishments

- The Village of Cumberland joined the service as a partner
- Construction of the new multi-sport artificial turf field began in September 2025
- With funding from the CVRD, the City of Courtenay started the process to develop a regional field allocation policy, central booking system and alignment of fees





# Trends, Challenges and Opportunities

- The demand for facilities outpaces the number of available and suitable facilities
- User groups are willing to pay (or pay more) if they receive value for service (i.e. improved facilities – surface, lights, washrooms)





# 2026 Work Plan Items

- Artificial Turf Field 2 completion Spring/Summer 2026
- Supporting the City of Courtenay in the regional field allocation policy development and fees framework
- Development of a regional field improvements/amenities grant program
- Artificial Turf Field 2 Agreement with Comox Valley Schools



## Additional Upgrades

The Comox Valley Recreation Commission has also identified these improvements, prioritized to proceed as an immediate priority:

- Added Lighting
- Improved Washrooms
- Upgrades to Field Access

These are a priority whether the fields are owned by the CVRD or others, such as School District 71. An investment action plan will be developed with partners.



# Regional Amenities & Field Improvements Program

- Development of a regional field amenities and improvements policy
- Support to rural community halls, municipalities and the school district that own and maintain sports fields for community use
- Provide incentives for investment into fields to increase the inventory of bookable fields within the region

The turf field and track both have replacement plans projected in future years, therefore ongoing reserve contributions of \$75,000+ annually are needed to ensure ongoing service delivery.

Artificial turf fields require no irrigation or fertilizers to maintain.

This service is built on strong partnerships with Comox Valley Schools, the City of Courtenay, and the Town of Comox as well as local sports organizations.

The construction of a multi-sport artificial turf field may lead to greater opportunities for accessible and inclusive programs.



# Options & Recommendations

Option 1: That the proposed 2026-2030 financial plans for the Service 601 Comox Valley Track and Fields be amended to include an annual \$200,000 reserve contribution (2026-2030) funded with taxation for the purpose of establishing a region-wide field improvements and amenities fund; and that the amended proposed budget be approved.

Option 2: That the proposed 2026-2030 financial plans for the Service 601 Comox Valley Track and Fields be approved.
